



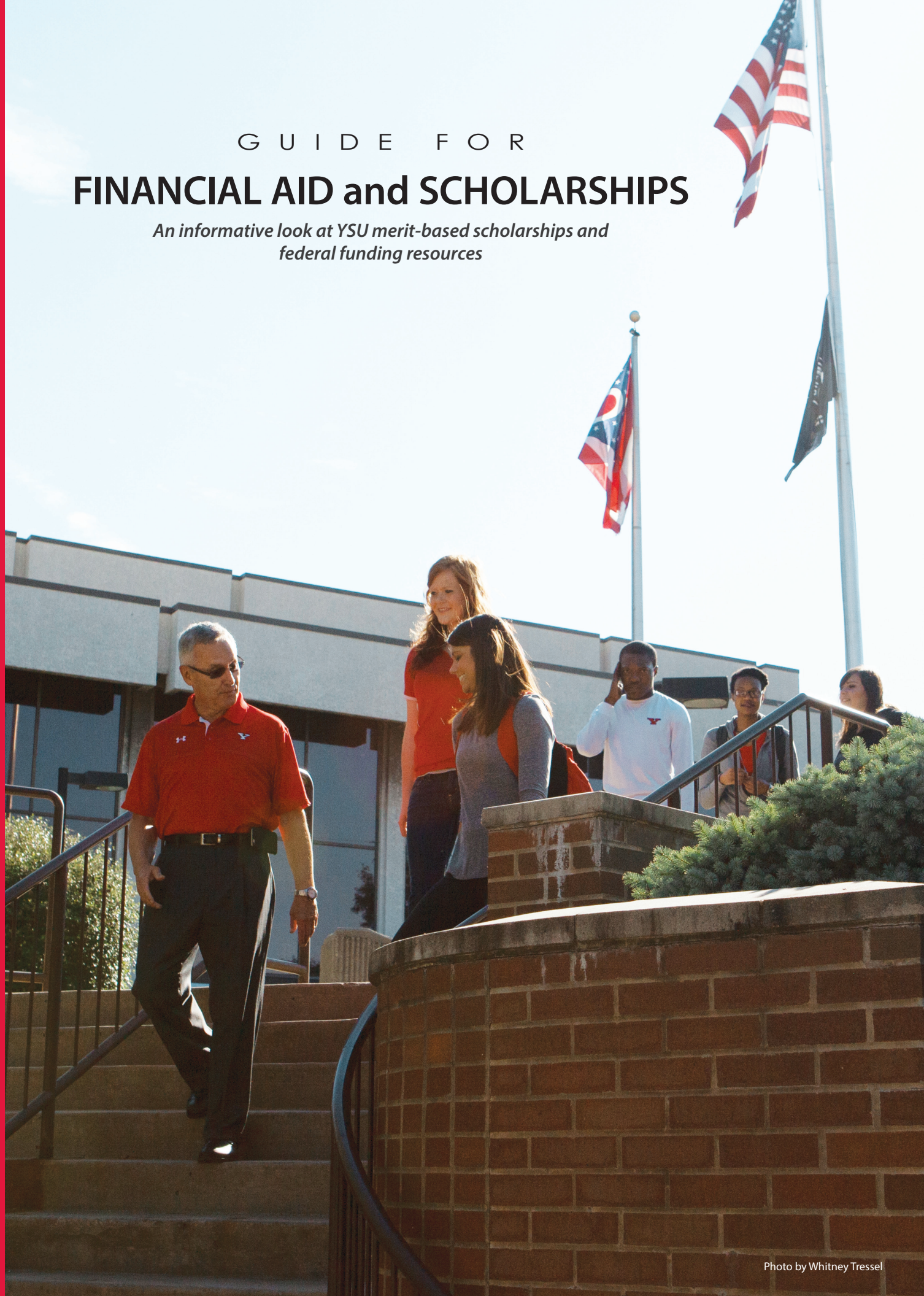

THE FINANCIAL AID PROCESS:

GETTING STARTED

1

APPLY FOR ADMISSION

The admission application process must be completed in order to be considered for YSU scholarships, particularly YSU Freshman Scholarships for Excellence, and to receive a financial aid package.

2

APPLY FOR AN FSA ID AND PASSWORD

Students and parents will need to establish individual Federal Student Aid (FSA) IDs and Passwords at studentaid.gov. FSA IDs and Passwords are required to electronically access and sign the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

3

COMPLETE THE FAFSA

The 2023-24 FAFSA will be available after October 1, 2022 at studentaid.gov. The priority deadline for FAFSA submission is December 1 for new students and February 15 for continuing students. The YSU six digit school code is 003145.

(Note: Students submitting a FAFSA can be selected for federal verification. Verification is a process that all universities receiving federal aid are required to complete. The purpose of verification is not to find fraudulent FAFSA applicants, but to find and correct common mistakes made during the filing of the FAFSA. All need-based aid packaging must be put on hold until a student provides the necessary information requested through the verification process, such as tax return transcripts. Please be sure to retain copies of all records – the federal tax returns, untaxed income statements, bank records, etc. – used to complete the FAFSA in case your record is selected for this review.)

TEST OPTIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Test optional merit-based scholarships will be awarded to incoming freshman students admitted under YSU's test optional admission policy. Scholarships will range in value from \$1,000 to \$3,000 through the Freshman Scholarships for Excellence program. Additional \$1,000 to \$3,000 test optional merit-based scholarships may be awarded to Honors College applicants who qualify for the Sokolov Honors College.

TRANSFER STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Transfer scholarships are available and offered through the generosity of the YSU Foundation. Transfer students are encouraged to apply early for financial aid and to observe the February 15 deadline for our transfer scholarships. Awards will be pro-rated if attending part-time (min 6 hours required).

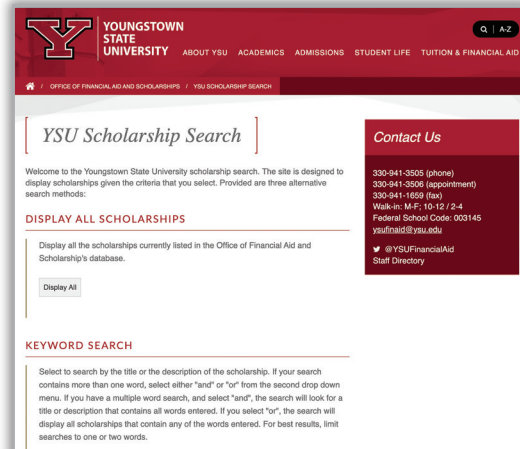
Current YSU students are awarded the Academic Achievement Award based on academic accomplishment. Awards will be pro-rated if attending part-time (min 6 hours required).

*Please note, students receiving any Freshman Scholarships For Excellence are not eligible to receive the Academic Achievement Award as students cannot be awarded more than one scholarship through the Scholarships For Excellence Program.

A Note on Education Tax Credits:

Please be aware that education tax credits can help offset the costs of education. The American Opportunity (Hope Credit extended) and the Lifetime Learning Credit are education credits you can subtract in full from the federal income tax, not just deduct from taxable income. To see if you are eligible for an education tax credit, visit **irs.gov/uac/am-i-eligible-to-claim-an-education-credit** to access the education tax credit calculator tool.

Financial aid is awarded in four basic forms: scholarships, grants, loans and employment.

Scholarships and grants are gift aid and do not require repayment. Loans require repayment.

Housing Grant Application

The 2022-2023 Housing Grant Application is provided for students who are planning to live in University Housing or Courtyard Apartments. The priority deadline for application is February 15 for continuing students and December 1 for all incoming new students. A Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is required and must be received by the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships prior to completion of the application.

The Housing Grant is available to new and continuing students on a first come, first serve basis. Need-based awards of up to \$2,000 per academic year are available to students who have financial need and live in University Housing or Courtyard Apartments. Preference will be given to students who live at least 30 miles from the University. Recipients must be admitted to the University and enroll full-time.

Please log in below to continue. The log in process will validate that you have met all conditions to request the Housing Grant. Those conditions include, but are not limited to, admission to the University, the completion of the 2022-2023 FAFSA, and the satisfaction of all outstanding requirements.

Housing Grant Application

Students who are planning to live in University Housing or the University Courtyard Apartments can apply for a Housing Grant by submitting the online Housing Grant Application on ysu.edu/finaid. The priority deadline for applying is December 1 for all incoming new students and February 15 for continuing students. A FAFSA is required and must be received prior to completion of the application. Need-based awards of up to \$2000 per academic year are available to students on a first come, first serve basis.

YSU Financial Aid Estimator and Net Price Calculator

Here students are able to estimate the potential financial aid offer they could receive when attending Youngstown State University. The estimator prompts the user to complete an online form, providing financial and demographic information. Upon submission, the student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and an estimate detailing eligibility for aid will be calculated.

YSU Installment Payment Plan

Normally, student accounts are billed each semester, with statements emailed to the student's YSU email account each time a bill is issued. Semester charges are due in full by the payment due date. YSU also offers a monthly Installment Payment Plan allowing the total amount due each semester to be spread out over several months.
